

## University Courses at Private Universities

According to the University Study Act and the 2002 University Act, university courses are degree courses. University degree courses at private universities are therefore basically subject to the same accreditation processes as other courses at private universities. University degree courses must be submitted to the Accreditation Council for accreditation.

A university degree course must be congruent with the overall profile and mission statement of the institution. The private university in question must have sufficient resources to run the course.

To guarantee the interaction of research and teaching, an appropriate proportion of the teaching staff on the degree course must be made up of the private university's permanent staff. Any new degree course may not take away resources from already existing courses, that is to say, the permanent staff for other courses as laid down in the Accreditation Council's basic criteria must be guaranteed in every case.
